# Pastor's Ponderings

It's not Tuesday, but here's a two-fer:

Dear friends, let's love each other, because love is from God, and everyone who loves is born from God and knows God.

1 John 4:7

Jesus replied, "Don't stop him. No one who does powerful acts in my name can quickly turn around and curse me. Whoever isn't against us is for us."

Mark 9:39-40

Jesus had been teaching about his purpose--welcoming God in welcoming even the lowly, the least, the children. When the disciples still don't get it, complaining and working against those who were not walking with them, Jesus responds.

Jesus speaks through time to our own our desire to judge one another, to feel smug and righteous, to complain and try to define how others should live and serve. We are often quick to condemn those who do things or say things a little differently.

But Jesus says folks who are trying to free and heal others, even those outside the disciple's group, are working for him. Three-fer alert: in another place (John 10:16), Jesus reveals there are others we don't know of who will come to follow and become one.

Sometimes, in today's culture, we can feel at odds with others: other churches, other religions, politics, mandates, etc. Remembering that everyone--some in very different ways--wants the best for themselves and their loved ones, perhaps we can keep Jesus' teaching in mind as we think about the work of the church. When we push for our own way, or act/speak against others working for a better world, we rob ourselves of teammates unnecessarily.

Let's keep our eyes open, looking for Love, looking for God...looking for teammates, partners in Christ (even if we don't call it that). We are more apt to find what we look for!

These Scriptures, and many more, remind us that we are not alone. There are others working to free the oppressed, give sight to the blind, feed the hungry.... We don't have to re-invent the wheel. We don't even have to turn or direct it. We only need to build bridges to partner with those already doing good work in the world, drawing nearer to God, relying on the wisdom of the Holy Spirit, and serving Christ together.

Pour your Spirit upon us, O Lord, Animate us with your gifts. Call us out upon this new and ancient way of following Jesus and partnering with others to continue the work of Jesus. Amen!
